

ISS guidelines for contributors 2017

International Sports Studies (ISS) is concerned with research and scholarship in the social sciences and humanities that focuses upon comparative and international study in physical education and sport. 'Comparative' may focus on research and scholarship in which some comparison is made across different continents, countries, regions, or cultures. 'International' refers to research that places work in a cross-national or global context. 'Area studies' or studies that focus on phenomena or events of interest within a particular nation or region have long had a place in comparative studies and will be welcomed in this journal. Submissions are invited from disciplines including but not restricted to sports history, geography, pedagogy and coaching, philosophy, psychology, marketing and management, and the sociology of sport.

All work submitted should be original, unpublished work, not under consideration elsewhere. All submissions undergo a thorough blind peer-review process. Accepted papers become the copyright of the journal.

Articles should be submitted by email as an attachment preferably in Microsoft Word. Manuscripts should be in English. Contributors whose native language is other than English are encouraged to consult an English Language specialist to ensure that the manuscript is suitable for publication.

- Manuscripts (up to 6000 words) should include an abstract of 150-200 words on a separate sheet, and have 5 keywords placed at the beginning of the article.
- Quotations of 35-40 words or more should be displayed as indented text.
- Try to avoid using too many notes. Where they are necessary, they must be brief and should appear at the end of the text and before the References.
- References should conform to the American Psychological Association format (see APA Publication Manual, 2009, 6th Edition).
- As far as possible any information that would lead to identification of the authors should be removed from the manuscript itself.
- A second file should be provided as a title page which includes the names of all authors in the appropriate order for publication with details of their institutional affiliation(s). The lead or corresponding author must be clearly identified and full contact details provided
- Internet sites must be cited according to the APA Style for citing electronic sources.
- Articles not conforming to the above specifications may be returned to the authors for correction prior to the review.
- The editors retain the right to make limited editorial change to manuscripts that have successfully completed the initial review process. Such changes will be returned to the author for approval prior to publication.

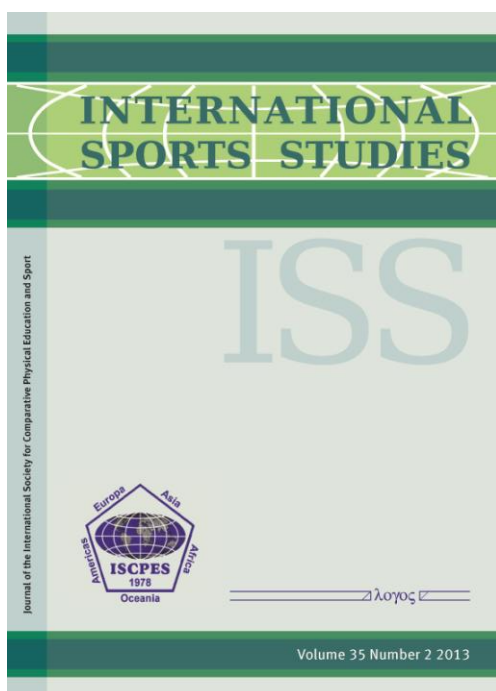
Submissions should:
